**Haitian Corner**

**Frères et Soeurs Bonsoir!**  
 En quittant la synagogue où il vient d'enseigner, Jésus se dirige vers la maison de Pierre. Il y guérit la belle-mère de Pierre qui était abattue par une forte fièvre. Puis, le soir venu, on amène à Jésus tous les malades. E Christ ne se contente pas de belles paroles. Il s'attaque au mal dont souffrent les hommes, le mal physique et le mal moral. Sa mission est de libérer l'homme de tout ce qui l'empêche de vivre pleinement. Les Evangiles nous parlent souvent de ce combat de Jésus contre l'adversaire de Dieu et des hommes. C'est un combat de tous les jours contre l'esprit du mal qui empêche l'homme d'être en harmonie avec Dieu, avec ses frères et avec lui-même.

Comme Jésus, nous sommes appelés à être attentifs aux souffrances des hommes d'aujourd'hui. Ces souffrances sont nombreuses. Les médias nous répercutent le cri des enfants victimes de violences dans certaines écoles, le cri des victimes de la guerre ou des catastrophes naturelles, le cri des malades dans les hôpitaux. Chacun pourrait en citer bien d'autres. Aujourd'hui, nous sommes appelés à nous mobiliser contre tout ce qui détruit la dignité et l'épanouissement des personnes. Comme Jésus, prenons le temps d'écouter, d'accueillir et de visiter celui ou celle qui souffre. Rien ne remplace le contact ni la rencontre individuelle.

Après avoir été l'homme de la Parole et de la lutte contre le mal, Jésus se retire pour prier longuement. Il prend du temps pour être avec son Père. Il nous fait comprendre qu'il ne peut y avoir de véritable évangélisation sans ce contact régulier avec le Père dans la prière et surtout dans l'Eucharistie. C'est là que nous puisons la force nécessaire pour la mission que le Christ nous confie.

Voilà donc ces trois aspects de la journée de Jésus : son enseignement, sa lutte contre la mal et sa prière. C'est sur ce chemin que nous sommes invités à nous mettre en route avec lui. Nous sommes engagés, nous aussi, dans les mêmes étapes que lui : témoigner par la parole, témoigner par l'engagement au service de celui qui souffre, et enfin confier tout cela au Seigneur dans la prière. En célébrant l'Eucharistie, nous nous tournons vers celui qui s'est engagé jusqu'au don total de lui-même pour cette mission libératrice. C'est avec lui que nous pourrons témoigner de la bonne Nouvelle de l'Evangile.
